


KSRA MODEL

Health and Nutrition –



Reversing Malnutrition, Reviving Traditions...

Our Impact

- 1,534 vulnerable beneficiaries reached.
- 200 children cared for in 20 rural crèches.
- 50 household nutrition gardens established.
- 130 people supported with critical nutrition packets.

How we did it?

We moved beyond supplementation to systemic change. By combining direct support (nutrition packets, crèches) with community-led solutions (like kitchen gardens, Poshan Bhoj festivals), we are not just bringing up the nutrition; we are reviving a culture of traditional healthy food habits.

Our success has drawn attention of the communities, making our model a blueprint for change.



Child Protection and Gender



Building Armor of Awareness Against Child Marriage & Trafficking

Our Impact

- 378 Child Marriages Prevented.
- 5 Girls Rescued from trafficking.
- 50 Villages actively monitoring and protecting children.
- 4,500 Children joined a powerful candle march for awareness.

How we did it?

We built a community-owned shield of protection. By forming adolescent groups (kishori groups), training communities to identify risks, and collaborating with authorities under Mission Vatsalya, we've turned villages into vigilant guardians of their children. We broke taboos by educating girls on menstrual health and providing sustainable hygiene kits, empowering them with knowledge and dignity.

- Nasha Mukt Gaon: A community-led movement ended illegal liquor trade in multiple tolas.

How we did it?

We believe true development is led by the community. We did the capacity building of the village women and equiped them to lead. Through persistent training, we helped Dari Panchayat go digital, revive its revenue system, and build infrastructure. Most powerfully, we supported women and leaders to rally against substance abuse, showcasing the incredible power of a united community.







Climate Resilience & Livelihoods



Women-Led Solutions for a Sustainable Future

Our Impact

- 100 Solar Home Lighting units installed.
- Trained Solar Sakhis: Young women certified as solar engineers.
- 500 Farmers adopted sustainable organic techniques.

How we did it?

Our climate action is led by those most affected. We trained and equipped young women as Solar Sakhis, turning them into tech leaders and earning community respect. This dual approach tackles energy poverty and gender inequality simultaneously. Similarly, our farmer training revives eco-friendly practices, ensuring food security and environmental care go hand-in-hand.



Adolescent Empowerment



Building Informed, Confident Citizens

In our continued commitment to empowering the next generation, we launched the **Adolescent Empowerment Program** with a focus on adolescent girls, supported by the **Paul Hamlyn Foundation**. This initiative aims to equip young girls with critical **life skills** that foster self-confidence, decision-making, leadership, and resilience in their daily lives.

Under the "Samvidhaan Jane" (Know the Constitution) campaign, adolescent groups are being sensitized about their rights and responsibilities as citizens of India. Through engaging workshops and participatory discussions, they are learning to raise their voices, understand social justice, and actively engage with democratic processes.

Games have become a powerful tool to educate children on topics like equality, freedom, justice, and duty—making civic education not just informative, but fun and transformative. This program is creating a ripple effect—building a generation of informed, aware, and empowered young girls who are ready to take charge of their futures and lead change in their communities.
